Confirm that the modelled dimensions and associated stack parameters including height, diameter and efflux velocity match the actual installed stack.	On or before 4:00pm on Tuesday 30 th May 2024
Additional information on the inputs for Ammonia, PCDs and Polyaromatic Hydrocarbons should be clarified as to whether the later version of the BAT reference document would lead to any changes in assumptions around modelling in the applicant's air quality consultant's opinion. The assessment has used an ambient concentration of Benzene but has not specified where this is from. It is assumed that this data has come from the 2001 background maps available on UK-Air but this must be confirmed.	On or before 4:00pm on Tuesday 30 th May 2024
The additional assessment has only completed sensitivity test modelling using NWP for NO2 concentrations, though the previous assessment work has identified risks from multiple different pollutants. Guidance for those receiving a Request for Information Notice:











(This guidance does not form part of the Request for Information Notice, but it is for the guidance of those served with the notice. Further guidance can be found in the PPC General Guidance Manual).

Dealing with a Request for Information Notice

This Notice requests information which the Council considers it requires for the purposes of the discharge of its functions under Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2010. The legal person/individual named in this Notice is required to supply the information detailed in the Notice or attached Schedule within the timescale specified.

Confidentiality

The person receiving the request may ask for certain information to remain confidential, i.e., not be placed on the public register. Asking for the exclusion from the public register of confidential information must be done at the time of supply of the information requested by this notice or any other notice. Clear justification must be given for each item wishing to be kept from the register. The onus is on the person asking to provide a clear justification for each item to be kept from the register. It will not simply be sufficient to say that the process is a trade secret. The test of whether information is confidential for the purposes of being withheld from the public register is complex and is explained, together with the procedures, in Chapter 8 of the PPC General Guidance Manual.

National security

Information may be excluded from the public register on the grounds of national security. If it is considered that the inclusion of information on a public register is contrary to the interests of national security, the person served with the Request for Information Notice may apply to the Secretary of State/Welsh Ministers, specifying the information and indicating the apparent nature of risk to national security. If such an application is made, the local authority must be informed and they will not include the information on the public register until the Secretary of State/Welsh Ministers have decided the matter.

Offences

Failure to comply with a Request for Information Notice is an offence under regulation 38(4) of the 2010 Regulations. A person guilty of an offence under this regulation could be liable under regulation 39 either on conviction in the Magistrates Court, to a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum (currently £5000); or on conviction in the Crown Court to an unlimited fine or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years, or both.
